**THANK YOU** for your kind welcome to myself, Emily and Evie. It was an honour to be 'collated and inducted' at the licensing! Inevitably parachuting from one parish to another (and indeed from one diocese to another) is a somewhat disorientating experience. On the positive side, it's also a chance to refresh/reboot both personally and professionally/ vocationally. I hope this will be case for everyone involved in St John's and St Luke's too - there will be many things I simply don't appreciate or understand, and I'll need your patience, but equally I hope that you'll be appreciative of a fresh pair of eyes and engage positively with the possibility of change. I intend to share some of my reflections with PCC after the summer, and any tweaks that happen in the meantime will be intended to try to clarify/simplify anything which might perhaps unintentionally have become a little onerous or where there's unnecessary duplication or confusing complication; so there may perhaps be a few changes along the way in the meantime, and a degree of necessary experimentation (some of which won't always work out) - but very much shared and discerned evolution rather than revolution in this initial phase. While trying to get the lie of the land over the summer and generally all have a bit of a rest, I'd very much appreciate any ideas or input that you'd like to share - to be clear it won't necessarily be followed up or acted upon, but it'll definitely inform my own thinking going forwards; what has worked well, what not so well; things to celebrate, areas in need of improvement etc. Just to be clear that's not feedback on me so far (!) as I'm very much learning as I go at this stage and will inevitably be making all sorts of mistakes and missteps and forgetting which church I'm at; it's more a chance to chip in any thoughts into the mix, your aspirations for our life together. And it's absolutely not about doing more, it could be consolidating what we do and finding the spiritual space to draw closer to God together. Outside the box or counter-cultural observations most welcome! I generally subscribe to the 'less is more' school of thought, although sometimes this is easier said than done, especially giving ourselves permission to slow down and see where it takes us.
