

## Policy for supporting applications to St Aidan's and Richard Taylor Schools, April 2020

At St John's and St Luke's we receive many requests each year to support applications for children to gain a place at St Aidan's Church of England Secondary School and Richard Taylor Church of England Primary School and we are happy to respond to these requests.

Both schools are part of the Yorkshire Causeway Academy Trust and have similar criteria when it comes to churches supporting applications for foundation places and can be found on their application forms:

Priest or Minister's signature confirming the above (Please be aware that the Governors will not be able to consider your application for a Foundation Place without a Church Leaders signature) As you can see, both schools need us to confirm how often parents and children have worshipped at either St John's or St Luke's over a three year period (if families have moved to the area within this three year period, attendance at another place of worship will be taken into account. Equally if a parent or child has come to faith and has become a committed member of the church within this 3 year period, this will also be taken into account).

Therefore in order for us to support your application (which we want to do) and be fair to all applicants, we will look at our Sunday school and creche attendance registers to ascertain your frequency of attendance and then complete the form accordingly.

We are aware that no register is taken at our parade/all age services, or at Café Church, but hopefully we will be aware of your attendance at these services.

## Please do not tick the appropriate attendance box(es) on the form ahead of us checking our records.

Obviously each school has a deadline for applications to be submitted, so we would ask you to contact us at least a week before the deadline to give us time to check our records.

We appreciate that getting your child into the preferred school is of utmost importance to parents, and so our clergy look forward to working with you to this end. One of the best times for us to look at your application forms is during our weekly church 'surgery' which takes place on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Thursdays of the month from 6.30pm to 7.15pm.
