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RECTOR'S LETTER



Dear friends

I'm sure many of you will agree that the last two years have been among the most difficult in living memory – we are still not completely out of the other side of the pandemic, we are facing what has become known as 'The cost of living crisis'; and on top of all this, we have the shock of the Russian invasion of Ukraine, a completely unjustified act that will affect all of our lives for years to come, without even mentioning the tragic impact on the Ukrainian people. Hardly surprising, then, that we are told that many people are struggling with their mental health, not least many school students. Now of course there are no quick fixes, no easy answers to these problems, and so we might find ourselves crying out with the Psalmist,

'How long, Lord, will the wicked, how long will the wicked be jubilant?'

Nevertheless, as we travel through Lent and approach Good Friday and Easter Sunday, we can know without question that God is neither ignorant of, nor indifferent to, the evil and suffering in the world – rather as we consider afresh Jesus' journey to the cross, what we are reminded of is that God cares so much that He sent His Son into the world to confront and overcome the forces of sin and death through his death and resurrection. This is why neither pandemic nor Putin nor anything else for that matter should cause us to lose hope. This is why come Easter Sunday, even if war is still raging in Ukraine at that time, we should celebrate, we should be joyful, we should sing God's praises at so great a salvation – for, as Paul writes in Romans, *'nothing in all creation can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus'*.

However, this is not to say that we should passively tolerate what is going on. Rather we should be among the people who are donating to the Disasters Emergency Committee appeal for Ukraine; we should be among the people who are signing up to offer space to Ukrainian refugees; we should be among the people who are supporting the work of mental health charities and community grocery schemes such as the one operating out of New Park School (see <https://resurrectedbites.co.uk/> and scroll down to the community grocery section), to give but a few examples. This is what it means to be an Easter

people, a people who **are** good news as well as know good news, a people who don't deny the reality of suffering in the world but who believe that ultimately God is in charge, that He is, as the old hymn puts it, '*working His purpose out, as year succeeds to year*' and that He can be trusted. The empty tomb is our proof of this!! Changing the subject dramatically, just to keep you in the picture about a couple of other things – First, the shortlisting for our new team vicar/mission-enabler post takes place on 6th April and the interviews take place on 28th April – so please pray we get good candidates and we have clarity about who God is calling to serve among us.

Then secondly a massive thank you to those who have responded to our appeal for people to increase their giving – as I write, the increase stands at a wonderful £1150 per month – which will go a long way to meeting our target of an extra £25,000 per year. And of course, it is not too late to think and pray about how you might increase your giving. Yes, it is a challenge to think about doing so in these hard times, but '*working together with God to see lives transformed in Harrogate*' is a vision worth giving to!

I close by quoting St Paul

*'Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more
than all we ask or imagine,
according to his power that is at work within us,
to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus
throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen.'*

Ephesians 3:20-21



ST JOHN'S WINS SILVER ECO AWARD



The Green Team is delighted to announce that St John's has just been awarded a silver Eco Church award by the A Rocha organisation. Eco Church is an award scheme designed to encourage and help churches in England and Wales to care for God's earth. Since obtaining a bronze Eco Church award in 2019, the Green Team has been working tirelessly with the clergy, members of the congregation and other teams, in particular the

Gardening Team to improve on this, and the silver award is a reflection of everyone's hard work. The award is split into five categories: worship and teaching; buildings; land; community and global engagement; lifestyle. Questions cover a range of topics, such as working out carbon footprints, sustainability, the mowing regime, the use of LED lightbulbs and preaching about environmental issues. A silver award is given when a certain number of points are reached per section – according to the Church of England's website, only 19% of all the C of E Eco Churches have a silver, so this is something to be rightly proud of.
